Downloading free music from a share ware site, ripping music from a friends library,	Use a streaming radio station like Pandora, iHeart Radio, TuneIn Radio App, You Tube viewing, Supporting artists by buying music from Apple Music or Spotify
Copying photos off the internet usually means you are taking copyrighted material. Since 1978 work does not have to have to be marked "copyright " to be copyrighted.	When using photos for a project either take your own pictures - or or go to a site with legal or public domain images.

When you buy a CD or DVD containing music, video, or a game and you burn a copy to give to others you are breaking copyright law. This is illegal and steals potential revenue for the artist.	Only one copy can be made as a personal backup for your use. Others need to purchase their own copy of copyrighted original material.
Taking music or videos off the internet and adding it something you are posting on social media (e.g., Facebook) is illegal and violates copyright law. Just because it is on the internet or on YouTube does not mean it is legal for you to upload. IF you are dancing got a song and post your self with the music you do not have the rights to the music.	Be cautious in taking original work off the internet. For example, if you are dancing to a song and post a video of your self with copyrighted music that you do not have the rights to then you are breaking copyright law. Even if music contains a “fair use” disclaimer you only can use a clip or small part of the song. Search for “legal music” to use.

<b>DIRECT</b> When a writer copies word-for-word another person’s words or ideas it is plagiarism.	In your composition quote the author and then explain how it applies to you
